From the Pastor's Pen

Early in my Christian life my church taught me that I came to Christ so I could give Him and others my life. Upon salvation I became His servant, the church's servant, and a servant to the world. Coming to Christ meant I lost my right to self-determination. We heard often Jesus' own words, "For the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life a ransom for many" (Mark 10:45). We learned these priceless gems of biblical truth over 12 months in three discipleship training modules during a meeting before Sunday evening worship that we called Church Training. (The world, the flesh and the devil have all but killed such effective ministries in most places).


A few years after my conversion I began to hear church people not involved in such ministries comment about some churches "I am not fed there," or "I am not a good fit there," or "I do not get much out of the services" or "no one spoke to me." I noticed that churches would advertise special studies and events for such people and then be embarrassed when a smaller than expected crowd materialized and nothing changed. Such people never seemed satisfied or "satisfyable." These were strange things to my eyes and ears. I felt like I was witnessing something less than the Christian faith.

It never occurred to me that I involved myself in Christ and His church for my personal benefit. Discipleship training had taught me otherwise. It taught me that I involved myself in a church for other's benefit, especially for the benefit, or glory, of Jesus Christ. I was free to look after His work and the needs of others, because He would take care of me. The only motivation I needed to attend and serve I thought was Jesus Himself. His birth, death, resurrection, commands, and promised return provided adequate fuel to light my fire. Churches did not need to market themselves to me. Jesus was enough. I rarely read the monthly church newsletter or the weekly bulletin. I didn't need to. I was already precommitted to attending no matter what the church offered, and this was before I ever entered the ministry.

I was just an ordinary high school and college student. My conviction was that I needed to be the kind of church member I expected my future congregants to be.

Boy, oh, boy was I in for a shock in my first church. People did not think the way I thought. They expected the church to meet their needs and had no discernable interest in Christ's glory or other's needs. The church existed for them, though they did not have the credentials to demand such attention; no one who hasn't been crucified does. I was saddened to learn, and am saddened now, that many American congregations and church members are more like consumers than they are like Christ.

At Beech Haven, we are different. We do not do what we do in order to gain anything for ourselves; we do what we do to give everything to Jesus. We come to serve but not be served. We aspire to be like Jesus, not like that narcissistic, whiny crowd that falls to pieces when its perceived needs go unmet. For our people at Beech Haven, Jesus is enough, and He is the best thing about us. What matters to Him matters most to us. He'll take care of our needs, but we are the only ones on earth who look after His work.

Armed with that mindset, we will be an unstoppable force for His majesty, His people, and His mission. That is why this Sunday December 4 will be such an effective Sunday. As I have announced since this summer, Dr. Ronnie Hill will share the message "Secrets of the Blessed Life" in the morning service. In the evening service, our Music and Worship Ministry will lead us in a Christmas celebration of "Light of the World." In addition, our Christmas Eve service December 24 at 4:00 p.m. and Christmas Day service at 12:00 p.m. will be well attended. Finally, changes to worship will be effective. Coming around the first of 2017, we will project the texts of sermons into Spanish and English (for the hearing impaired) on a monitor. Children grades K—3 will participate in the first part of our worship service, and before the sermon we will play an appropriate video so they can transition out of the worship center into the children's worship area.

It is with this mindset (Jesus is enough, and He is the best thing about us) that we will advance in our God given mission. He will take care of our needs; we must see to it that He is glorified, other's edified, the world evangelized, and hell left horrified.

Armed with a vivid imagination and a healthy dose of creativity, my playtime as a child was not powered by batteries. A single Hot-Wheels car and a long church hallway could entertain me for hours (and often did during lengthy Choir practices!). At best, battery powered toys merely enhanced the play.

In our society today, we've largely forgotten the true power behind Christmas. Oh, we're quick to jump into the "Christmas spirit," so long as we don't actually define it. And we love celebrating our generosity as we give gifts. We even enjoy the vague spirituality as we wish for peace on earth and goodwill toward men.

But just as my battery-powered toys could never truly "power" or create my play as a child, no amount of glittery decorations, festive parties, or even generic "good will" truly empowers us. They might provide momentary enjoyment, but January is a miserable month for those whose only hope is in the "Christmas spirit."

The focus, the significance, and indeed the power of Christmas is all centered on Christ. Without Him, everything else is a shallow festival which lasts only a moment. With Him, Christmas celebrates the arrival of true and eternal hope and joy.

But even Christ's birth can't stand alone. The virgin birth is indeed miraculous and crucial, but it means little without the cross and resurrection. God became man for one purpose, not so that we could give gifts and wish for peace, but so that He could die in our place and provide a way for us to know the saving power of God.

The power which grants us true joy, peace, hope, and love, the power which sustains us and guides us year-round, the power which equips and enables us to do His good and perfect will - that power is the power of Christ in us. And it's only when we have Christ that we can recognize the truest significance of Christmas.

May we then make every effort to demonstrate and to share the power of Christ.

Stewardship Corner

Charitable Giving Strategies

Gift of appreciated real estate. If the real estate is given to the church and the church sells the real estate, then the church pays no taxes, and the donor receives a charitable deduction for the fair market value of the real estate given to the church. The fair market value of such real estate will be deemed to be the price at which the real estate was sold by the church.

When considering a gift of real estate to the church, it may be helpful to ask the following questions:

- (a) Do you have any current use for this property?
- (b) Do you have a financial need to retain this property?
- (c) Would a large capital gains tax be due if you sold this property?

If you answered "yes" to any of these questions, you may want to consider making a gift of the property to the church.




