From the Pastor's Pen

Beech Haven Church Family:

It occurred to me a few months ago that the missionary movement did not become a global reality until the United States involved itself in it in the early 19th century. I will not rehearse a comprehensive or balanced history here, but prior to the United States' involvement in missions, most biblically defined missionary efforts addressed isolated spots on the earth. Missionaries envisioned a global missionary effort, but their circumstances prevented a global effort. They did not have the economic resources; their economies struggled to provide enough for people to survive. They did not have the political environment. Wars and government restrictions hindered serious missionary efforts. The theological environment hindered them, too. Roman Catholic theology advanced the church of Rome but not the saving, biblical gospel, and European Protestantism was never very missionary.

When the missionary vision came to the United States, everything changed. The United States had a free, growing economy that produced income levels that afforded giving to missions and missionaries. Religious liberty prevailed in the United States so that state and federal governments did not interfere with the biblical agenda of missionary minded people. Theologically, the United States has always had a robust Biblicism so that ministers and lay people have felt obligated and free to implement the missionary mandate of the Bible in their lives and churches.

I provide this little missionary history to point towards 2017. We can legitimately say many things about the economy, but a positive one involves the Dow Jones Industrial Average which has rocketed past 19,000 and today approaches 20,000. I am cautiously optimistic about religious liberty. If the promised supreme court appointees materialize, it may enjoy a resurgence. Theologically, America is in need of significant help, but we are witnessing a resurgence in the interest in biblical and missionary theology among Bible believers in the United States today. The circumstances are such that we can advance in the mission of Christ locally, nationally, and internationally.

Worship & Music Ministry Notes

"He must become greater; I must become less." John 3:30

Every minute, an estimated average of \$35,600 is stolen in the US by identity theft. In the last six years alone, the total amount has risen to more than \$112 billion. Armed with a name and a 9-digit social security number, thieves can wreak havoc on a person's credit and bank account in a matter of minutes. Not surprisingly, in light of this exponential rise in identity theft, companies are turning to both high-tech and low-tech solutions (like security questions) to help thwart this threat [that's easier to type than to say...]. Suddenly, your mother's favorite color and the name of your first hamster are vital to your identification.

It is true that our identity extends far beyond our name and social security number. To some people, our identity revolves around our association with a family member. For instance, among Ministers of Music in Georgia, I'm largely known as John Cotten's son (as his 40+ years in that circle have made him fairly well-known). But even family connections fail to tell the whole story, as I'm much more than "John's son."

Consider, then, what your answer might be if you were asked, "Who are you?" Aside from family, most people probably would respond with their career or job title. "I'm a nurse." "I'm an engineer." "I'm a homeschool mom." Our careers do indeed help to identify us (as evidenced in my family, a distant grandfather did indeed own a cotton plantation, and he apparently couldn't spell...), but likewise fall short of truly identifying us.

Sometimes our accomplishments or achievements serve as major identifiers. Coming out of high school, as I was applying for music scholarships, one of my most important identifiers was my status as an All-State musician (trombone and voice) and Governor's Honors participant. But again, there's more to us than our old trophies.

Even our entire resumes and family histories fail to tell the whole story of our identity. Why? Because our identity includes not only what we've done in the past, but how we respond in the present. In fact, total strangers often identify us in part based on very brief encounters. For instance, a waitress might not know our name, our job, or our family, but she can discern much about our identity based only on our countenance, our kindness, and our generosity. The same is true for guests who see us in worship...

So, what identifies you the most? Your family? Your job? Your accomplishments? My prayer is that we might all have the same perspective as Kraft Cheese founder J.L. Kraft. A century ago, it is said that someone once approached Kraft and asked, "Who are you?" Kraft responded, "I'm a Christian." "No, I mean, what do you do?" replied the inquirer. "I tell people about Christ," said Kraft. "No, I mean, how do you make money?" "Oh, I sell cheese."

John the Baptist would have liked Kraft (and his cheese...). Multiple times, John was quick to say that he was not the Messiah. In fact, his entire identity revolved around pointing people to Christ. His simple declaration in the verse above would be a great prayer for us all: "He [Christ] must become greater; I must become less."

My prayer is that our chief identifier might not be a name, a number, a job, or an accomplishment, but Jesus Christ. May everyone around us, whether a total stranger or our oldest friend, see Christ in us, and may we make every effort to help them gain an identity in Christ that can never be stolen.


