From the Pastor's Pen

Church Family:

John Piper has popularized the notion that God's purpose for missions consists of gathering worshippers for the glory of God. The way he articulates it is to say "Missions exists because worship does not." In other words, God's motive for sending the church into the world is to gather people in Christ's name to worship God. While Piper overstates this point, nearly to the exclusion of all other biblical motives for missions, we may say that one of God's motives in sending us into the world is to win others to Christ so they will worship and glorify God. Paul elaborates on this point with Old Testament quotations in Romans 15:7—12. For example, he wrote "Praise the Lord all you Gentiles, and let all the peoples praise Him" (Rom 15:11). Scripture articulates other motives for missions-God's love (2 Cor 5:14) and Christ's Lordship (Matt 28:18)—but if kept in biblical balance, Piper makes a helpful point. Worship provides a powerful incentive for missions. This is a good word for a Great Commissionary church. From this flow two truths about the relationship between missions and worship. First, the Great Commission provides a powerful prompter for worship. God loves the world and sends the church to the world to win the world to Christ. This is why we know Christ. Someone responded obediently to God's command to go, delivered to us the gospel, and now we know Him! Who could not worship a God like that? It would take a cold, hard heart to refuse to worship a God like this. We will be hot-hearted for Him because of His grace in mission.

Second, we are justified when we take missions into consideration in worship planning. In other words, we consider the outside world when selecting music, instruments, and orders of worship. While we do not use worship to appeal to the world to attend worship—we appeal only to God, for we want Him to attend our worship—we are obligated to give our world worship by which it can offer authentic worship. This explains in large part why worship has changed through the years in music

selection, instrumentation, and orders. Change is necessary because neither the church nor the world live in a static, changeless state. All live dynamic, changing lives.

For this reason, soon we will experience some new items in our worship. One Sunday soon the Missions Committee will debut a monitor onto which we will upload almost simultaneous sermon text in English and Spanish. This monitor will appear in a prominent place in the worship center where our hearing impaired and Spanish language friends can read the message as I deliver it. We hope to add other monitors to include other languages. Monitors will probably prove to be a pleasant distraction for several Sundays, but soon we will adjust to their presence.

This Sunday our student worship band will lead worship. They will debut a new sound system and drum set, both which we have needed for some time. This band is a benediction to our souls. They are more than "cute kids" though they are that. They are good. They are sincere. They display some of the best features of the kingdom and our church. They are the fruit of the investment of their parents, church, and their God. Some may be tempted to say "They are the future of the church!" While that is true, it is also true that they are the present life of the church.

Great Commissionaries tie worship to the Great Commission. The Great Commission sets the broad context for worship. I am grateful this is a settled issue at Beech Haven and it needs no rehashing. While I have not articulated a comprehensive philosophy and theology of worship here, it is enough to say that our philosophy and theology of worship are set and we have moved beyond discussions some churches have had on these matters. While I will not involve myself in any discussions on these matters in the future, it is always appropriate to direct to Tim questions and suggestions. We will remember, however, that we are not interested in excluding the Great Commission or God's world in worship planning. Are you not glad God did not exclude us?

Worship & Music Ministry Notes

"If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness." 1 John 1:9 The large harvest moon was particularly bright the other night, and my dog Luke politely asked to go out to bark at it. Not speaking 'dog', however, I thought he just needed to relieve himself, so I let him out. When his intentions became clear a few minutes later (much to the chagrin of our sleeping neighbors), I went out and whistled for him to come back inside.

In the moonlight, I could see the war raging inside my 100lb Labrador's head: "My master has called... and I ought to obey... but the moon is bright and I want to bark at it..." I called again, and much to my delight, Luke started heading back inside. He was obeying, sort-of.

His pace was excruciatingly slow, as if with each step he were evaluating the polling data - 51% for "Obey," 49% for "Keep Barking." Ok, another step...

In the ten minutes it took him to meander back to the house, it dawned on me that we behave the exact same way far too often. God speaks to us and calls us to obey in some area - we know that He loves us and that His will is best, but we have a hard time turning our backs to the desire to bark at the moon. So we obey partly, or slowly, or with the wrong heart. Such "obedience," however, isn't.

One area which causes most believers particular difficulty is the call to confession. At its core, confession is simply agreeing with God about something. It's agreeing that He is correct in His view of things. We may have no problem confessing that Jesus is Lord (Phil. 2:11), but when the exact same word is used to encourage us to confess our sins (1 John 1:9 above, or James 5:16), our obedience is often lacking. Such confession requires the unpleasant task of agreeing with God about our failures. Confession admits guilt, and therefore can be quite humbling, uncomfortable, and even painful. But unless we acknowledge it, God will not remove it.

Confession, then, is obviously required by anyone seeking salvation. But the great saints fail sometimes and fall short of the glory of God. Any unconfessed sin thus serves as a barrier between us and our loving Father. Confession, then, is a necessary part of worship, for it is impossible to offer to God acceptable worship if such a barrier still stands. God cares not how well we sing to Him if our hearts are still harboring sin. He is not impressed with our attendance in Sunday School, or even our knowledge of the Bible if we're allowing some sin remain.

Every time we gather to worship, then, let us begin by confessing our sins. Can't think of any? Then consider praying David's bold prayer from Psalm 139:23-24:

Search me, God, and know my heart; Test me and know my anxious thoughts.

See if there is any offensive way in me, And lead me in the way everlasting.

When our master calls, may we always obey joyfully, confessing our sin and eagerly seeking His good, pleasing, and perfect will. Soli Deo Gloria.

New Drums & Sound System

Soon, you'll notice that the Operations & Facilities Committee has updated our drums and sound system. The new drum set, though it will look and feel like a traditional acoustic drumset, is still fully electric and controlled by the sound board. Along with an upcoming audio system upgrade, including the addition of sound-absorbing panels in the rear of the worship center, the new drums will provide much-needed clarity and quality of sound. The old set, meanwhile, will be utilized in Building 'D,' where it will provide better sound control in that smaller space.

Did You Know?

Christian Concern Fund

The Christian Concern fund is a designated fund used to meet benevolence needs, both among our church family and the community at large. By far, the greatest needs which Beech Haven is called on to meet, and which have been met, are for members of the Beech Haven family—such as, medical expenses, rent or mortgage payments or utilities for those out of work or between jobs, and income supplements for those temporarily unable to work due to illness or surgery.

Beech Haven helps community members with utility bills by appointment only. Individuals call the financial assistance phone line (706.548.7084) on Monday mornings at 9:30 a.m. to make an appointment for Tuesday afternoon. Steve Skelton, Roger Burrell, June Martin and Cyndi Weatherly each serve as interviewers/counselors one week per month. They assist individuals with the application, review the bill, discuss the client's current situation, and spend time praying with the client.

The Christian Concern fund is not a budgeted item in the general church budget; therefore, the only funds available are from designated offerings to the fund. Offerings may be given to Christian Concern at any time, although a special opportunity to receive Christian Concern offerings is provided each time the Lord Supper is observed. Prayerfully consider making an extra generous gift to the Christian Concern fund.

Charitable Giving Strategies

"Every good thing bestowed and every perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father," James 1:17.

Gift of publicly traded stock or securities. The benefits of giving appreciated stock or securities to the church could best be explained by way of example: Let's assume that someone acquires stock in ABC Corporation for \$10,000 and has held that stock for a number of years. The stock has appreciated in value and is now worth \$50,000. One could sell the ABC stock for \$50,000.00 and would have a taxable capital gain of \$40,000 (\$50,000 - \$10,000). Applying the applicable federal and state capital gains tax, the shareholder would pay approximately \$10,000 in federal and state capital gains tax. This leaves a net amount of \$40,000 which could be given to the church.

The result is that the church receives \$40,000, the donor receives a \$40,000 charitable deduction, and the federal and state governments receive \$10,000. Conversely, if the donor gave the ABC stock to the church and the church sold the stock, the church would not be taxed on the sale of the stock. The result is the church will receive \$50,000, and the donor would receive a \$50,000 charitable deduction and no taxes would be owed.
